

The holy gospel according to Luke the 21st chapter.





But not a hair of your head will perish. By your endurance you will gain your souls."

receive our prayer.


Consoling God, abide with all who grieve for loved ones who have died (especially). Comfort us with the promise of resurrection and new life with you. Lord, in your mercy,



LORD'S PRAYER (LBW p. 91)


Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us.


