40 Negative Propositions about Lutheranism

This last Sunday was Reformation Sunday, where we commemorated Luther's nailing of 95 points of debate about the sale of indulgences on the door of All Saints' Church in Wittenburg, an event often pointed to as the start of the Lutheran Reformation. Inspired by these 95 points, I sent a prompt out to a cadre of Lutheran Pastors from around the country, to see what they felt were necessary statements about our faith today. After some back and forth we came up with 40 statements. Following the model Luther gave us in his explanation of the 10 commandments, these statements go from negative to positive, "Lutheranism is not this, but that." So, as we quickly move from Reformation to All Saints and onward to Advent and Christmas, take a moment to consider these statements about Lutheranism. See if they

August 9, 2022

Righteous Recipes Broccoli Cheese Dip

1 pkg (8 oz) Philadelphia Neufchatel cheese, softened

1 cup sour cream

1 env. (0.7) Good Seasons Mild Italian Dressing Mix

1 pkg. (10 oz.) frozen chopped broccoli, thawed, well drained

1 pkg. (7 oz) shredded cheddar cheese, divided

Heat oven to 350.

Beat first 3 ingredients in large bowl with mixer until blended. Add broccoli and 1 1/4 cups of cheddar cheese.

Spoon into 9 - inch pie plate.

Bake 20 minutes.

Sprinkle with remaining cheddar; bake 5 minutes or until melted.



Family Promise

Big news from Family Promise! After a very long journey through red tape, the Flemington Planning Board, and community opposition, there is light! On October 25, the Flemington Planning Board declared that The Promise Center, transitional housing for Family Promise of Hunterdon County, is inherently beneficial- a designation crucial for the approval of the application. Now, finally, plans can move forward and permits can be applied for. There are some improvements and changes that will be made to the Annex of Calvary Episcopal Church to turn it into The Promise Center. The Promise Center will then become the permanent shelter for families while they are in the Family Promise program.

What this means to SRLC? We will no longer host families in the church building itself, but we will continue to support Family Promise by providing for the needs of the families for three weeks out of the year. This support will come in the form of home cooked meals and some hospitality. Family Promise will hire staff to stay in the facility with the families over night and some other hours. Many of the details

are still being worked out. This arrangement allows more stability for the families while still fostering relationships with community and church groups.

Our weeks for being hosts in 2023 are as follows:

April 23-30

August 13-20

November 26- December 3

We still have commitments THIS year!

Coming up soon: our next outreach is that of being Christmas Angels for a Family Promise family. This coming holiday, we will be providing Christmas gifts for a family of 6, (two parents and four kids). The wish list will be sent out with a SignUpGenius so you will be able to select items you wish to purchase. Look for a notice and email in the coming weeks. All gifts will be due by December 4th.

Last hosting of 2022: our last hosting for this year is for the week of November 27. Since the guests are still staying in hotels, we will be providing their groceries for the week. It has become the norm for the families to request ShopRite gift cards, as they have their own transportation and are able to do their own grocery shopping. This means, you can start picking up

Shop Rite cards NOW through SRLC or at the store. Look for an e-mail and announcement to come.

Thank you for your continued support of this important outreach. We are blessed to have many willing to help both at SRLC and at our support church, St. John Neuman Church in Califon.
