A Lenten Challenge

Lent is a 40-day period where Christians are encouraged to more intentionally and more passionately practice their faith. The three traditional practices of the season (paralleling the Ash Wednesday readings of Matthew 6) are Alms, Prayer, and Fasting.

Alms: Giving or collecting money or goods for those in need.

Prayer: Communicating to God our awe and thanks, our confessions and requests.

Fasting: Refraining from an action or item that you feel damages your relationship with God, your neighbor, or the creation.

These are tried and true Christian practices that have long formed God's Church. I hope some or all of them may be included in your Lenten devotion.

I would also like to offer three other Christian practices that have, in one way or another, popped up in the "Faithful Journey" training our congregation has been partaking in, Conversation, Reading, and Discernment.

North Hunterdon Food Pantry

The North Hunterdon Food Pantry had a very successful Reverse Advent Food Drive for the Christmas holiday. Our community and friends were very generous.

In January, the Lebanon Township Museum included us in their Martin Luther King Day festivities. The pantry received needed paper and hygiene items for the pantry along with a generous ShopRite Gift Card donation.

Currently, we are preparing for the March and April distributions along with the preparation of the special Easter Distribution which includes everything needed for a complete Easter meal.

In February, we had two Girl Scout troops help the pantry shelve donated groceries and separate pasta and soups. The large volume of soups were provided by Boy Scout Troop 92. Pictured is Brownie Troop 81310 sorting tomato sauce and Daisy Troop 80488 learning about the pantry. We are thrilled for the donation of 2,351 pounds of food and essential items from the community that Boy Scout Troop 92 and Cub Scout Pack 92 collected from the Scouting for Food event at local grocery stores. The latest update from
Family Promise is that they are in
the process of applying for
permits to do some construction
on the building in Flemington that
will become the "Promise Center."
They hope to open this permanent
shelter in April. Family Promise is
also in the process of submitting a
grant to fund a new initiative that
would allow FP to do outreach and
engagement for those experiencing
street homelessness.

Our next "hosting" is May 21-28. Maybe, just maybe, we will be actually providing some meals and our companionship by then. At FP, they are re-imagining the current model to continue the compassionate support for families. New rules and regulations are being established further to govern the center. We won't know exactly what will be expected of us until the time gets closer.

In the meantime, keep the program and the families in the program in your prayers.

Conversation: You may have noticed those two containers of marbles in front of the altar in the sanctuary. Those marbles represent 120 God Conversations I've challenge the congregation to have before the end of 2023. 120 "What's God up to in your life?" 120 "Gee, what's that doing to your soul?" 120 "What's the why behind that choice?"

I just counted the marbles and we're off to a good start, with 24 marbles moved to the larger container, meaning members of this congregation have talked with someone about what God is up to 24 times already! We've already met 20% of my challenge to the congregation, imagine if we were to have 24 more God Conversations this Lent!

Reading: While a good portion of the Bible gets read every three years in worship, and we've been roaming through wide swaths of the Bible in our various Bible Studies, there is still so much more to begging to be read. This Lent I would encourage you to read the Bible widely and deeply.

Wide: Here are a few ways you could read a fair bit of scripture during Lent. Every day during Lent read: a chapter of Matthew and a Chapter of Exodus or a chapter of Acts and a chapter of Isaiah, or read through the books of Job, Proverbs, and Ecclesiastes, or read Romans, 1st Corinthians, and 2nd Corinthians.

Deep: Find the bulletin from the previous Sunday and read the Gospel lesson aloud to yourself three times. After the first read through notice how a particular word, phrase, or idea feel particularly important to you.

After the second read through ask what that word, phrase, or idea means to you today. After the final read through ask yourself what actions might be a proper response to this word, phrase, or idea.

Discernment: Another practice you could do this Lent is creating a Discernment Journal.
Once a week find half an hour to consider what has happened in your week in light of the following three questions: What does the world need? What do other people say I do well? What gives me joy? Your answers to these questions should help you discover or refine what your purpose is and discern God's calling on your life.

I pray that these 40 days will bring challenge and success, blessing and renewal, that they might strengthen you on your journey with Jesus.

Recipes from the Congregation

Easy Cheese Danish

2 cans cresent rolls

2 8oz pkgs of cream cheese

1 egg, separated

1/2 to 2/3 cup sugar

1 and 1/2 tsp vanilla

powdered sugar for dusting top

Pre-heat oven to 350 degrees.

Roll out 1 can of crescent rolls into 9×18 pan.

Combine cream cheese, sugar, egg yoke, and vanilla until smooth.

Spead mixture evenly onto the crescent rolls in the pan.

Roll out second crescent on top of cheese mixture*, to cover.

Brush top with egg white.

Place in oven for 30 minutes or until golden brown.

After letting it cool, dust with powdered sugar.

* You can top the cream cheese mixture with cherries, blueberries or pineapple! Then, cover with the second roll of crescent rolls. Bake a little longer.
