North Hunterdon Food Pantry

This is a busy season for the food pantry. We loaded the pantry freezer with 40 turkeys for the Thanksgiving distribution. The special Thanksgiving bags included along with a turkey, all the necessary items to prepare a full Thanksgiving meal including the Pumpkin Bread prepared by a local Girl Scout group. We had 32 families receive the special bags along with their regular monthly distribution. Again, all our dedicated regular volunteers arrived and helped. Also volunteering to pack the special bags and the regular monthly distribution bags were two very enthusiastic Girl Scout groups. They did a wonderful job.

Now we are preparing for the Christmas distribution which again will include a special Christmas distribution bag along with the regular distribution. The Knights of Columbus in Long Valley has again this year donated 20 turkeys for our pantry freezer. We hope to contact our Girl Scouts again to help shelve groceries and pack the distribution bags. Karen has prepared the 'Reverse Advent Calendar' again this year. Watch for announcements in the bulletin and on FaceBook for suggested items that the pantry needs.

Our neighbors, friends, clubs and organizations continue to donate to the pantry which is always appreciated, and we would like to thank them all for their generosity.

Council Meeting Highlight

September 12, 2023

To date, over half has been received for the congregation match required for the Synod Excellence in Ministry Unleashed (EMU) grant.

Invoice for winter snowplowing was not received until July.

Pastor presided over the funeral of Robin Halozan at SRLC. Over 100 people were in attendance.

Pastor will be attending a continuing education seminar, "Kindling Faith: Sacred Places Transitions." Will gather nformation on sharing/leasing extra space within the church building.

Pastor has a new Synod commitment – Facilitator for First Call Theological Education.

Pastor will conduct the first worship service at Rolling Hills care facility October 15.

Pastor will be on vacation Sunday, December 31. A worship lead is needed for this service.

It was discussed that outside worship services should have a rain date, or a way to provide notification to move back to the church building.

Worship & Music

Blessing of the animals will be October 8.

A multi-church ecumenical Thanksgiving service will be held prior to the Thanksgiving holiday. Details to follow.

The first week of Advent is December 3. Setting 3 will be used.

The solemn Longest Night service will be held Thursday, December 21 at SRLC which will include a special musical presentation.

There will be 2 services Christmas Eve, both offering communion – 10:00 am (with pageant) & 7:00 pm (with extended musical offerings). The choir will sing at both services.

A letter was received from Lutheran Social Ministries thanking SRLC for our gifts of school backpacks.

Lebanon Township Community Day is Saturday, September 23 from 1:00 – 6:00 pm. The church and the food pantry will each have a table.

This year's Sunday School curriculum will cover Old Testament heroes.

Families of prospective Confirmation students will be contacted. Classes will be scheduled based on response. First Communion classes will be scheduled.

Jeff Smith will chair the Holistic Stewardship committee. The first meeting will be scheduled for later this month. The goal is to kick off the stewardship campaign prior to the holiday season.

Having a clothing recycling bin at SRLC is being investigated.

Installing a columbarium niche wall in God's Acre cemetery was introduced.

Ideas for the 250th anniversary celebration are being gathered.

October 10, 2023

The church mission statement is critical to the "why" of the congregation. The SRLC mission statement is in need of updating.

A letter was received from Synod Council thanking SRLC for our 2023 mission support.

It is recommended that SRLC send thank you notes when special donations are received by the church. The availability of note cards is being checked.

Outdoor fall clean-up is scheduled for November 11.

The front steps are in need of power washing.

As of today, we only have 22 marbles in the original container, meaning this congregation has had 98 conversations with our neighbors about God! And from what folk have told me, we've found out some interesting things. Some people we've talked to have been hurt by the church, others sincerely believe in pagan gods, and still others desperately wish they could worship in a Christian community, but inconsistent work schedules and overwhelming obligations, make corporate worship a luxury they cannot afford. We've talked with people of strong convictions without any religious background, Jews with whom we share much, and even found out longtime friends were Lutheran, but had never talked faith with them before.

I encouraged us to have God Conversations for two reasons. First, because the Acts of the Apostles demonstrates clearly that the Church's main job is to catch up with what the Holy Spirit is already doing in the world, and talking to people about faith is an excellent way to notice what God is already up to.

Second, because Lutherans have this problem-Lutheran Laryngitis. The average Lutheran invites someone to church every 22 years, but the average person only accepts such an invitation every three times it is offered... so the average Lutheran successfully invites someone to church once, maybe twice, in their lifetime. When asked why they don't invite people to church, the answer is that they imagine it will be awkward, and that they don't have practice. Well guess what, we've had 98 chances to get over being awkward, and 98 instances where we as a congregation practiced talking about the faith! And we're coming up on some pretty important holy days in the church calendar, each one an opportunity for conversation and invitation: We're in the season of Advent, a season of waiting, what do you wait for? We're heading into Christmas, what was your favorite Christmas experience? Epiphany opens up God's presence among us to everyone, where do you see God at work these days? Our Longest night service will be on December 21 st at 7pm, would you like to join us for a

quiet time to grieve and remember? We'll be holding a Christmas pageant on Christmas Eve morning at 10am, and our traditional candlelight service on Christmas Eve at 7pm come on out and watch. Come join me at our Epiphany Crafting event on January 6 th . I hope these God conversations point us to where God is at work, and have taught us to invite our neighbors to join us in celebrating the works of God to which this holy season points.

Recipes from the Congregation

Lemon Garlic Dip

½ cup raw almonds (or other nut)
½ cup non-dairy milk (more if needed)

- $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon garlic powder
- 2 tablespoons nutritional yeast
- 1 tablespoon Dijon mustard
- 3 tablespoons lemon juice
- 2 teaspoons apple cider vinegar
- 1 teaspoon low-sodium soy sauce



1. In a blender or food processor, combine almonds, non-dairy milk, garlic powder, nutritional yeast, mustard, lemon juice, vinegar and soy sauce. Blend until smooth.

2. Serve as a dip on a platter of Crudités. I especially like it with broccoli.
