North Hunterdon Food Pantry

The pantry had a good Fall and Winter season. Every distribution day was clear, some a bit chilly. We distributed approximately 35 Thanksgiving and 35 Christmas special holiday meals to our clients along with the monthly distribution. We are gaining 1-2 additional clients each month.

The pantry received a lot of needed donations from the Reverse Advent Calendar donation drive and a lot of help bringing them to the pantry and shelving the donated items.

We have partnered with Veteran's Haven North to assist veterans that are discharged from the program by providing them with some pantry staples and simple meals for a few days. Watch for more information on the VIBE (Veteran's Initial Basic Essentials) program and how you can help!

Family Promise

New year, new chance to get involved with the Family Promise outreach ministry. If you would like to help out and be more active in Spruce Run's participation with the homeless population of Hunterdon County, reach out to Wendy - wdinapoli@comcast.net). There are opportunities to help with donation drives and hosting events.

The Promise Center, the only permanent shelter in Hunterdon County for families, is complete and awaiting state certification. Once families have moved in to the facility, we will get clearer information on what "hosting" them will look like. What I know is that volunteer opportunities will be a combination of new and old. I know that hosting groups will be bringing groceries, cooked dinners, and on weekends, bringing breakfast, lunch and dinner. There will be a paid staff member there for overnights, but volunteers will be able to come and visit and engage with clients in the common area of the house on weeknights and throughout the weekends. Council Meeting Highlights

November 14, 2023

- The mission statement requires updating. Online research was presented on how to create an effective mission statement. Council members to each create a mission statement, and they will be discussed at the December council meeting.
- The "Fund for Mission" grant application has been submitted.
- Repair to the chimney liner is complete. Additional issues were found with the chimney (banding) and the slate roof. Estimates will be obtained.
- Guidelines for building & property usage have to be established.
- Thanksgiving Eve service will be November 21, High Bridge Reformed Church will host.
- The VBS program "What a Mess" will be done in the summer of 2024. It will be done again with other local churches.
- Pledge cards will be available November 12.
- SRLC is in queue to have security cameras installed.

- The new broadcast camera is installed. The existing wireless mics work with the new camera. Pending training for new system.
- A date for the celebration of Bernice Meyer's 100th birthday to be discussed with her family.
- The copier lease has been renewed.
- Jingle Bell Junction will take place November 18. WELCA will be donating 75% of the proceeds from the cookie sale to the SRLC general operating fund.

December 12, 2023

- No response yet on the status of the "Fund for Mission" grant.
- Will discuss the possibility of rotating vespers with the Ecumenical Pastors.
- The building usage form will be reinstated.
- Security cameras will be installed the week of December 18.
- The new broadcast camera is installed, issues have been encountered. Troubleshooting is in progress.
- Estimate for the repair of the chimney banding & slate roof was received.
- The ELCA Youth Gathering will be

- discussed further. Will pursue having SRLC join with Cross Roads.
- Additional temple talks will be held.
- The 250th anniversary committee is being established.
- Longest Night service will be December 21. The cellist that played last year will play again this year.

as the nature of a congregation. We're not a corporation or club, not a government or secret society.

We're a group of people who share a trust in Jesus Christ, our numbers fit the outer bounds of an extended family, and there probably is as much diversity of thought amongst us as would be found at a typical family reunion. And, however badly we might do it sometimes, we love and care for each other.

Everything we do as a congregation ought to be done in response to God's loving kindness found in Jesus Christ, and because we trust that God has created, redeemed, and is making us holy us, we can do all our works together with joy—as a celebration.

Worship is the ongoing joyful reception of the good news and our rejoicing in response to it—Gospel and Thanksgiving, Gospel and Thanksgiving! When we gather together in fellowship

we're gathering as the resurrected body of Jesus Christ, that's something worth celebrating. When we serve our neighbor, we are not offering anything other than what we first received, we are like beggars pointing to where we found a blessed feast.

One of the worst parts of being a Lutheran is our propensity toward "Lutheran Laryngitis," that is, the average Lutheran shares their faith once every 28 years. That's why it is so important to have welcome be part of our mission, that we can be an outward facing congregation.

That we're inviting folk on a journey is equally important. We're naming that our own faith life as a congregation is in process. As the well-loved "ventures prayer" names, God has called us "to ventures of which we can not see the ending, on paths as yet untrod, through perils unknown." We're not looking to impose some ridged ideology on those who would joinus, but instead we're seeking to find what the Spirit is up to among us.

Recipes from the Congregation

Slow-Cooked Loaded Potato Soup

5 c peeled & cubed potatoes
1 small onion, finely chopped
4 1/2 c chicken broth
1 clove garlic, minced
3/4 t salt
1/8 t pepper
8 oz cream cheese, softened
& cubed
1/2 c half-and-half
1/8 c butter, cubed

Toppings: 1/2 lb bacon, cooked & crumbled

1/2 c shredded cheddar 1/4 c minced chives

Place potates and onion in slow cooker; add broth, garlic, salt, and pepper.
Cook, covered, on low
8-10 hours or until potatoes are tender.

Mash potatoes to desired consistency. Stir in cream cheese, cream and butter. Cook, covered, 15 minutes longer or until heated through.

Just before serving, whisk soup to combine. Top servings with bacon, cheese and chives.
