# North Hunterdon Food Pantry

The North Hunterdon Food Pantry client list continues to increase. Thankfully, when our shelves are sparse, we always manage to fill them up with wonderful new donated food. The pantry was one of four that received a generous donation from the Flemington Rotary soup sampler event. Donations are used to purchase items that are generally not offered by Norwescap. In particular, we use the donations for meats and in the summer we add kid friendly choices to our client selection list.

In addition to the March distribution, we added a second distribution that included all the makings for a complete Easter dinner including a ham, donated from the Clinton ShopRite. Each child also received a bag filled with Easter treats.

We are currently working on supplying our client's children with additional funds to purchase food while they are on summer break These funds were awarded to the pantry via a grant received from the New Jersey ELCA Synod.

The pantry has created a new program VIBE (Veteran's Inital Basic Essentials). This program provides veterans leaving Veteran's Haven North with a small supply of non-perishable food. Currently, we have supplied 18 veterans with starter food. For information on items needed, how you may help or to find out about the program, please pick up a flyer at the church or ask any volunteer from the pantry.

We are truly blessed with a very giving and caring community which enables us to supply assistance to families in need.

# Council Meeting Highlights

#### January 14, 2024

- Operating income increased over 2022. To date, 18 pledges have been received toward the 2024 budget.
- "The Synod "Fund for Mission" grant was awarded and will be used for VBS, monthly fellowship and the food pantry (to supplement clients with children in providing breakfast and lunch during the school break).
- The new mission statement will be presented to the congregation at the annual meeting.
- Sanctuary roof repairs are complete. The appeal will again be presented to the congregation at the annual meeting.
- Installation of security cameras is complete.
- A building use liaison has to be identified.
- Shrove Tuesday "Breakfast for Dinner will be Tuesday, February 13 at 5:30 pm.

- Bernice Mayer's 100<sup>th</sup> birthday will be celebrated on Sunday, February 18<sup>th</sup> at SRLC.
- Due to state regulations, Family Promisse will not be able to use any of the items SRLC previously used for hosting. Items will first be offered to members of SRLC. Anything remaining will be donated to Catholic Charities.
- Pending confirmation if any students from SRLC will attend the Youth Gathering.
- The ecumenical Pastors will be meeting to discuss Lenten Vesper services.

#### February 20, 2024

- Bernice Mayer's 100<sup>th</sup> birthday celebration was well attended – 74 in person / 50 virtual.
- There will be a cello concert in the sanctuary on Saturday, March 23 at 4:00 pm. In lieu of donation, the cello instructor will once again play at the Longest Night service in December.
- ShopRite of Flemington will be hosting a celebration Tuesday, March 19 for being the winner of September 2023 "National Hunger Action Month." SRLC is invited.

- The thermostat in the Fellowship Hall is not working properly.
- An electrical outlet is needed in the choir loft to support the new broadcast camera equipment.
- Sue O'Brien is replacing Danielle Beyers on the Fellowship & Outreach committee.
- No students from SRLC will be attending the Youth Gathering this year.
- To date, \$1,000 has been received for the roof appeal.
- 22 pledges have been received toward the 2024 budget.
- Karen Smith will be conducting training in the use of the broadcast camera.
- A policy for congregation notification during inclement weather has been established.
- A list of events is being compiled for the 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary of SRLC, with the kick- off occurring in Dec 2024.
- To save money on postage, mailings will first be made available to congregation members on Sundays. Those not picked up will then be mailed.

#### March 12, 2024

- First Communion classes are complete, Confirmation classes are continuing.
- Meeting ecumenical Pastors to schedule monthly summer outdoor worship & the possibility of a "pulpit swap."
- Received a note from Bernice Mayer thanking SRLC for acknowledging &celebrating her 100<sup>th</sup> birthday.
- Sonia Cordova has joined the Fellowship & Outreach committee.
- Katie Ressel has joined the Youth committee.
- Additional worship assistants are needed. Personal invitations will be extended.
- Mary Lomerson delivered historical photographs & documents from the Ralph & Ron Lomerson collection.

- The April council meeting will take place at CrossRoads Camp & Retreat center April 16, 2024, at 5:30 pm. Dinner will also be provided.

On the 16<sup>th</sup>, we'll widen that question out into the classic Christian question about the tension between Experience and Revelation.

On the 23<sup>rd</sup> we'll try to wrap our heads around the idea of Post-Modernity—the Philosophy that most people think rules our current age.

Then finally, on the 30<sup>th</sup> we'll ask a big question: "What happens when there is a crisis of faith for a whole society?" While this is a meaty fare, filled with big ideas, I promise you I'll keep things down to earth, interesting, and applicable to our life of faith!

#### Church, the Hard Parts:

Every summer we try to do an outdoor learning event, we've been calling it Carriage House Learning, Two years ago, I taught us about non-canonical scriptures, last year I led a study on an early church catechism called The Didache. This year's subject is: Church the Hard Parts; things are going to be a little different, while I'll be co-teaching these sessions, lay leaders in the congregation will be taking the reins and discussing where the rubber hits the road in Christian Community. It will be 4 weeks on subjects such as: Service, Reconciliation, Finances, and Leadership.

#### God Conversations

Think back to when I first introduced the God Conversation marbles. 120 of 'em! It was a stretch. the idea that we could have 120 conversations with our neighbors about God, faith, folk's deepest values, hopes, and dreams—all of that, was a lot. But today, as I'm writing this, we're down to 4 marbles left and one person has already told me about their latest God Conversation. We're almost there, we're hitting our mark, fulfilling our goal!

What was that like? Risking the conversation? Noticing when people are going deeper with you, when conversation cuts to the bone, or touches the soul! I'm currently reading a quirky book, Hunting Magic Eels: Recovering an Enchanted Faith in a Skeptical Age, and the author contends that much of what our society currently lacks is the ability to notice—to notice God at work, and name it as such.

Those 120 conversations you all have had are doing just that, getting into the habit of noticing, and also re-enchanting your neighbor's life.

We're allowing people to name that which goes beyond the everyday, to be in awe again! To look up from screens, live beyond mere consumption, and imagine that those moments where heaven and earth meet the Kingdom of God are not only possible, but probable. I hope this practice we've picked up as a congregation continues, that we witness to our faith, learn what the Holy Spirit is already doing among our neighbors, and notice the possibilities God is graciously giving to us!
